

# CONTINUING EDUCATION

## ALL CLASSIFICATIONS

30 total hours; no more than 15 online hours

- Live/interactive webinars qualify as live hours
- Pre-recorded courses qualify as online hours

### Class C:

- At least 2 hours specific to the administration of enteral anesthesia/pharmacology

### Class D:

- At least 8 hours anesthesia specific didactic hours
- At least 10 successful sedation cases

### Class E:

- At least 16 hours anesthesia specific didactic hours
- At least 30 successful sedation cases

# CLASS IV

## CLASS E

Allows administration of deep sedation and general anesthesia.

- ACLS or PALS
- No additional requirements
- Additional CE requirement

All dentists that hold a Class IV license will automatically transition to the class E license.

# Pathway Options to New Classification

## CLASS I

---

### CLASS A

Allows administration of local anesthesia.

- CPR or BCLS/BLS
- No additional requirements
- No changes to CEs

### CLASS B

Allows administration of minimal sedation by nitrous oxide.

- BLS or BCLS
- Anesthesia letter
- No changes to CEs

## CLASS II

---

### CLASS B

Allows administration of minimal sedation by nitrous oxide.

- BLS or BCLS
- No additional requirements
- No changes to CEs

### CLASS C

Allows administration of minimal sedation by nitrous oxide with or without the administration of a single enteral drug.

- BLS or BCLS
- Utah Controlled Substance License
- Additional CE requirement

## CLASS III

---

### CLASS C

Allows administration of minimal sedation by nitrous oxide with or without the administration of a single enteral drug.

- BLS or BCLS
- Utah Controlled Substance License
- Additional CE requirement

### CLASS D

Allows administration of moderate Sedation.

- ACLS
- Utah Controlled Substance License
- Additional CE requirement
